



## Elton Bennett Art Show at Lakewold Gardens

LAKEWOOD, WA – Lakewold Gardens is hosting a spring showing of Elton Bennett's hand-silkscreened, purely northwest artwork March 13-15. The original artwork on display is from Evelyn Bennett's personal collection who is Elton Bennett's daughter.

The show will include selected color variations from the 55 titles from his 1970's inventory and unusual and rare works from his early artistic career in the 1950's. These images depict the Pacific Northwest at the turn of the century through the mid 1970's. Many have become a slice of history, seen through the artist's eye. They include fishing trollers, ghostly clam diggers, tall ships and buoys, logs floating downriver, and rainforest enclaves. The viewer is drawn into the artwork, experiencing a sense of mystery, stillness, and contemplation. His art depicts the quintessential northwest environs: it is visceral and evocative, rich and intense yet stylized and graphic. Definitely a must see!

Along with the art show is artwork available to purchase, such as: 3/4 size 'giclee' limited editions, 12 x 16 matted reproductions, and a new line of note-cards. Prices range from \$10 to \$1400, although a few very rare hand-pulled silkscreen prints are over \$2000. This artwork ranges from images along the northwest coast, tall ships, wild grasses and ferns of the rain forest, the Olympic Mountains, Mount Rainier, and several whimsical prints. Over thirty museum quality framed originals will be available along with a portfolio group of additional scenes and color tones.
